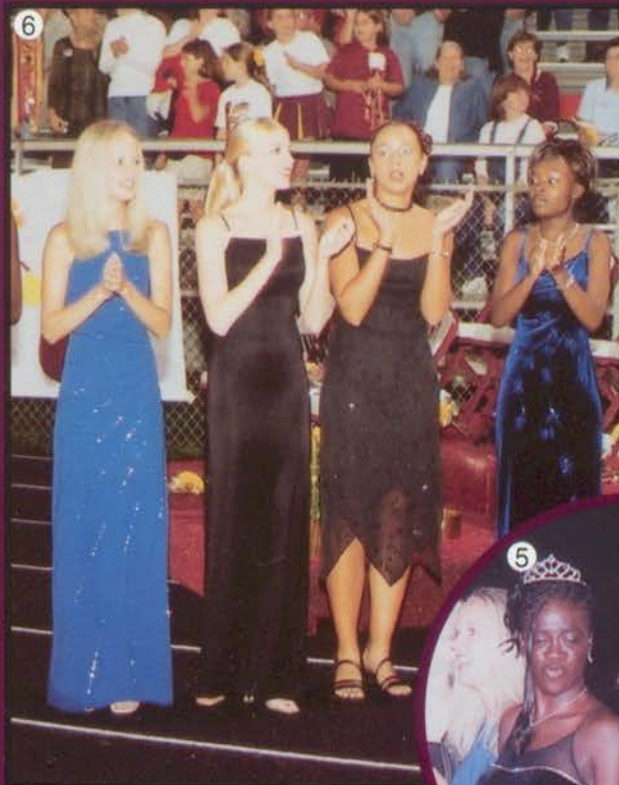

Fighter jets flew hit-and-run missions. Now they know we are a force not to be taken lightly, and, for once the people of Afghanistan are able to live a life without worry of repression.

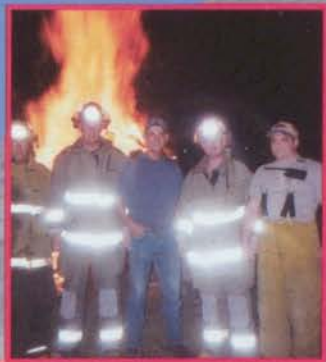

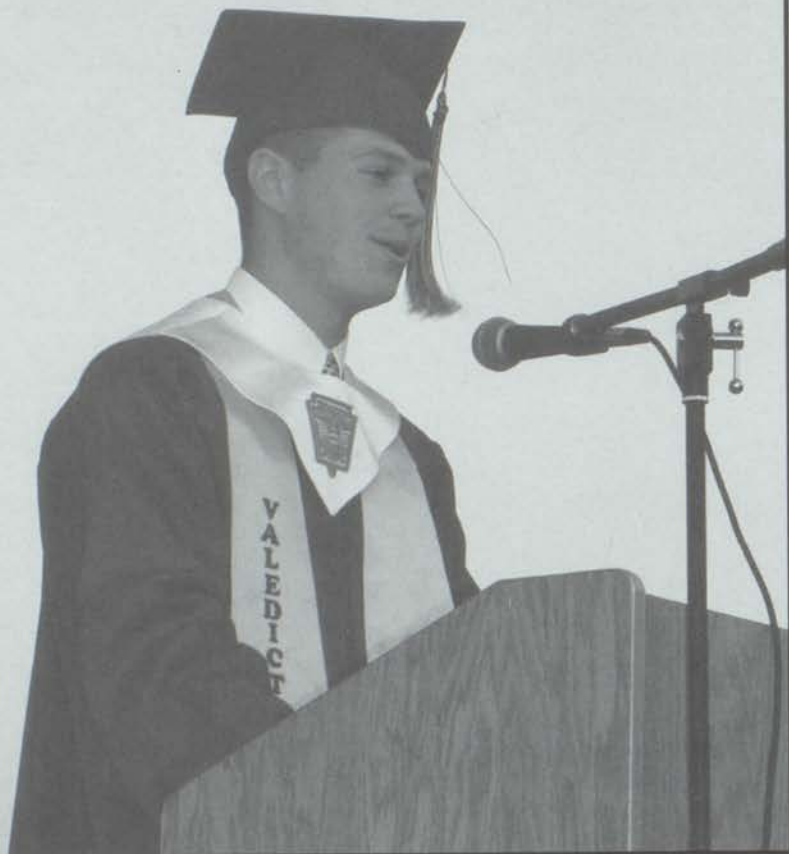

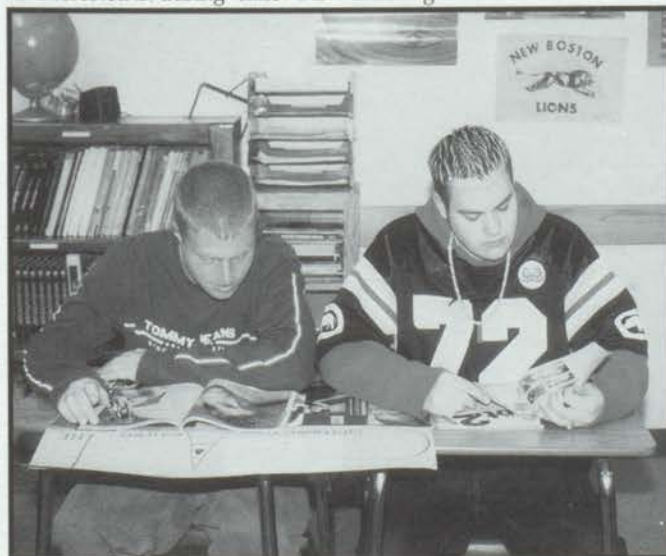

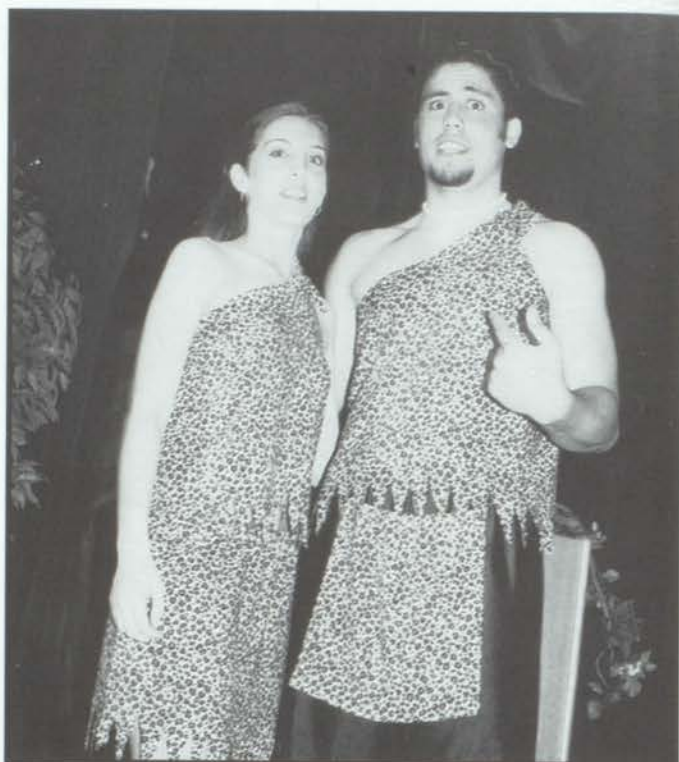

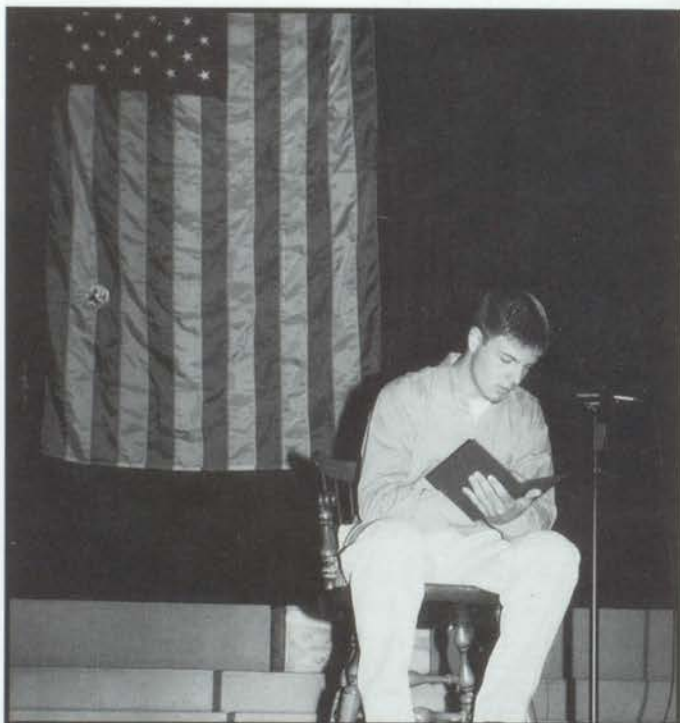

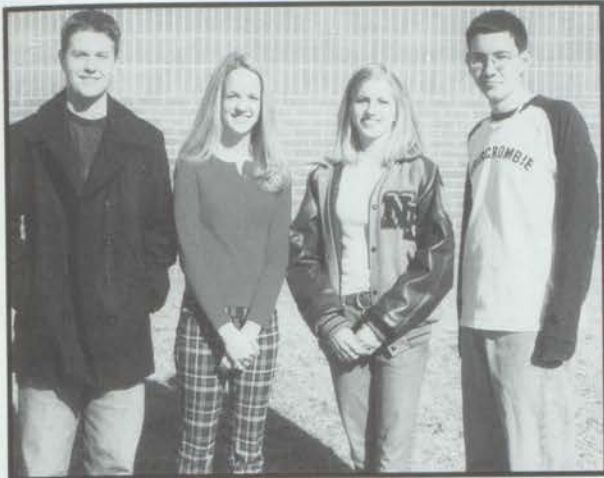

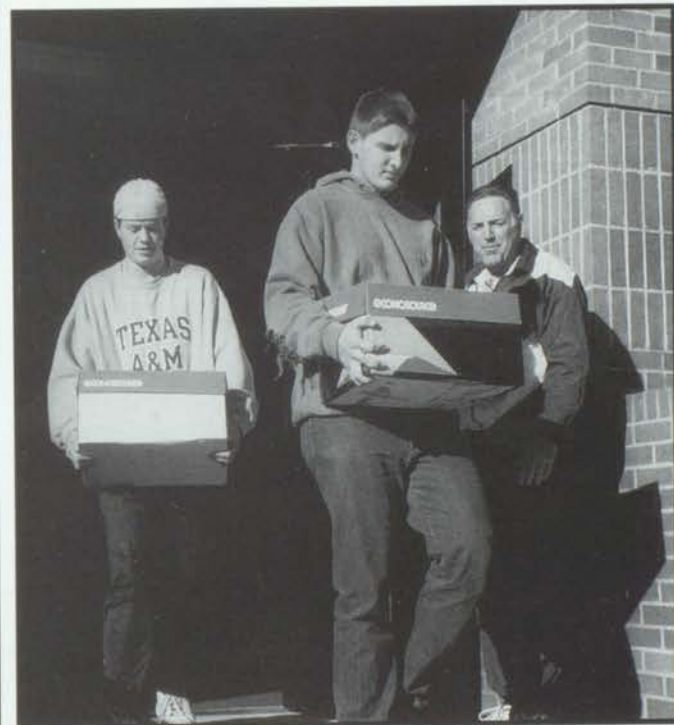

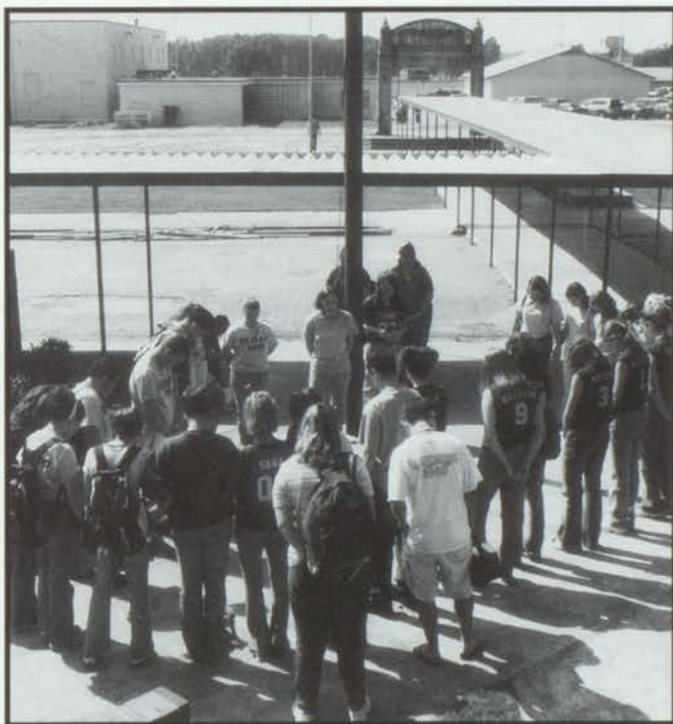

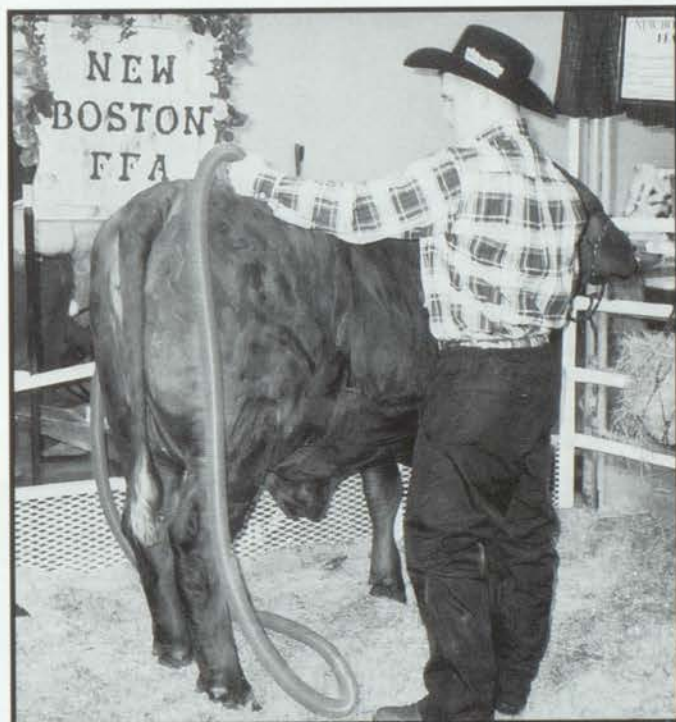

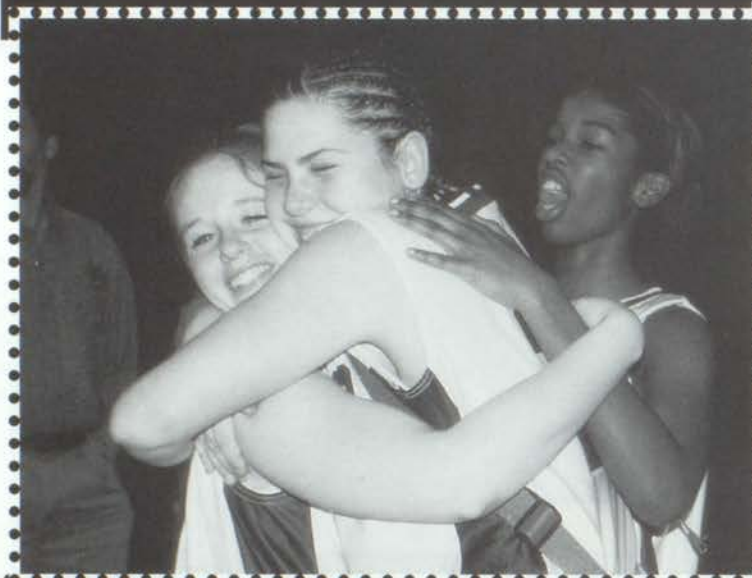

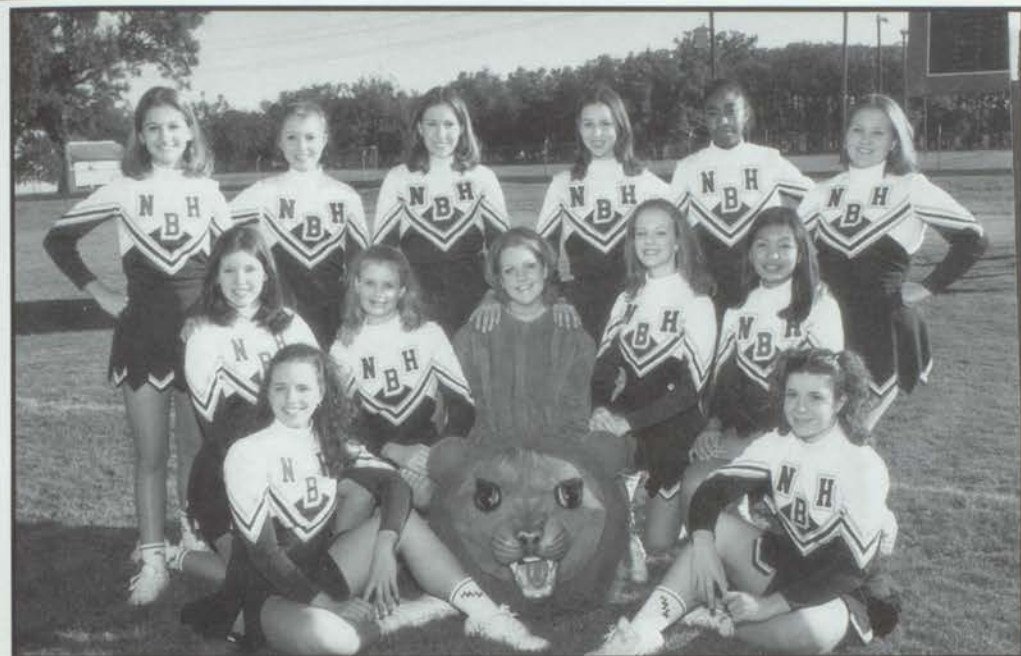

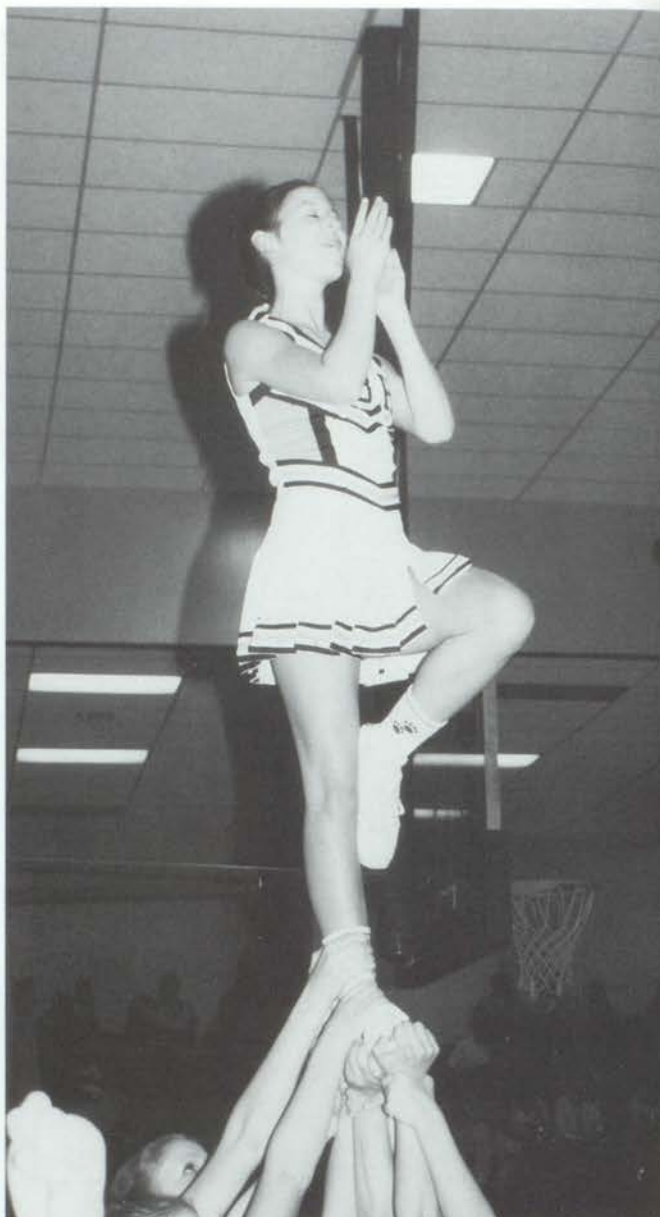

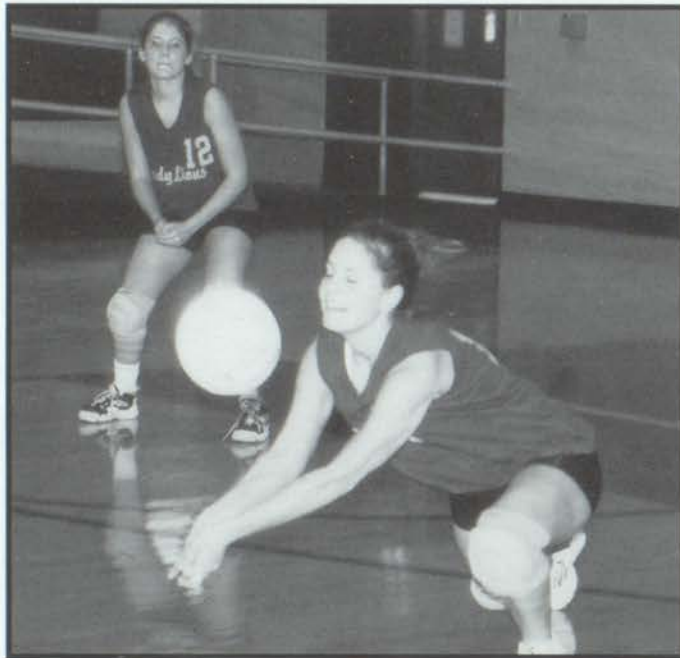

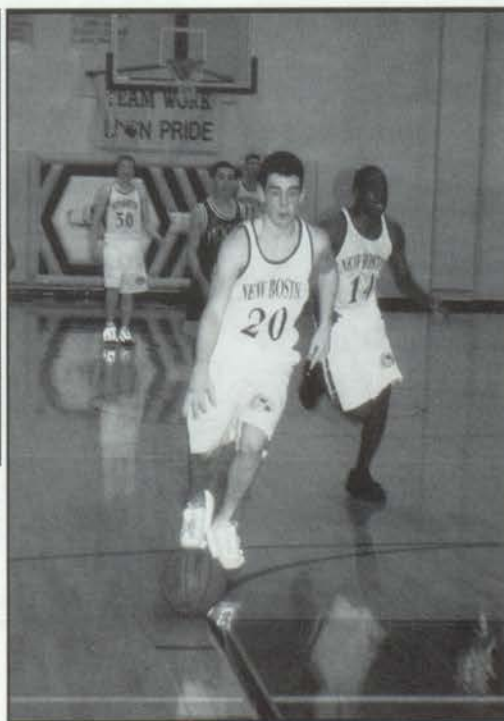
