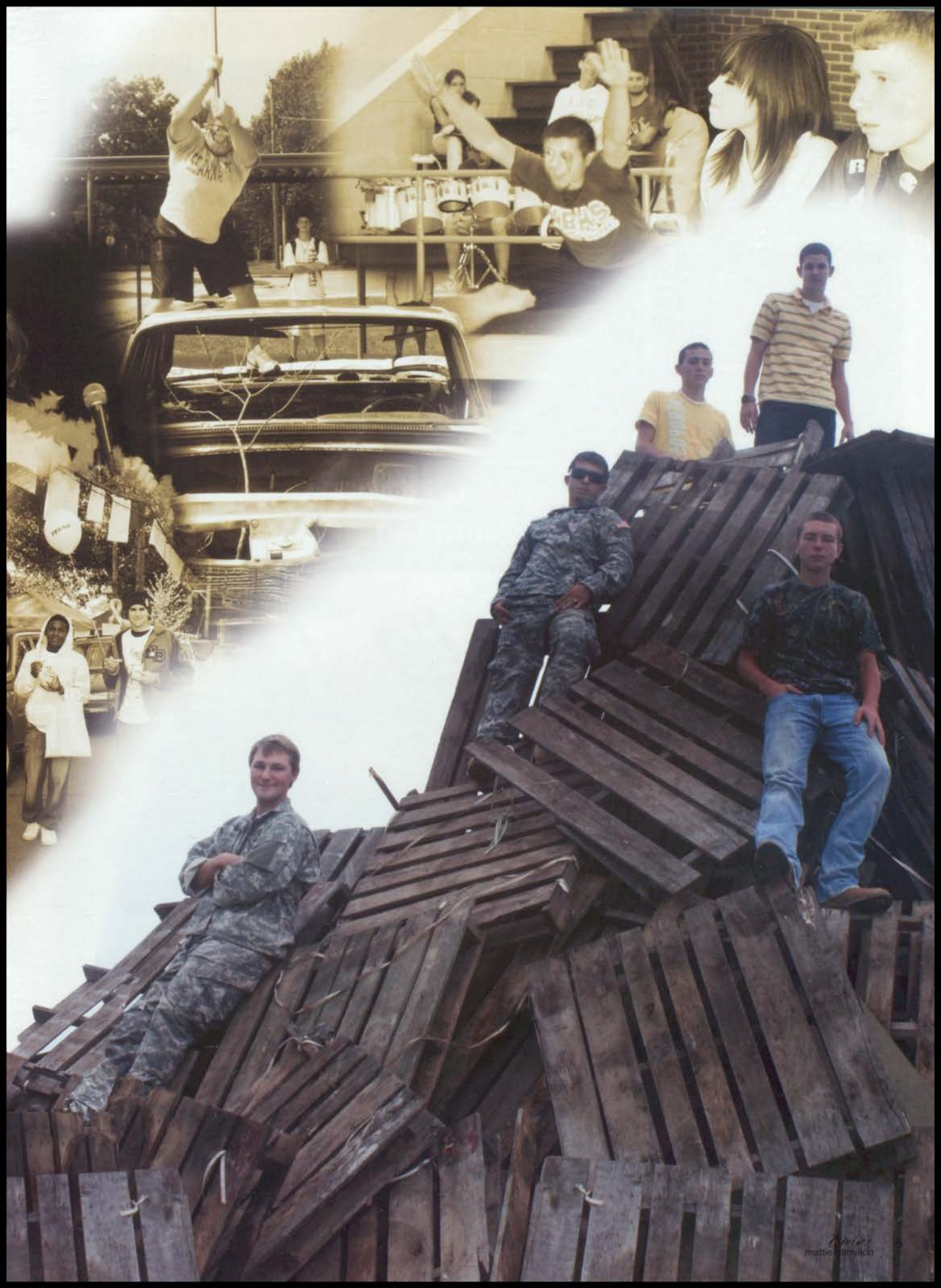
# Extreme Positives

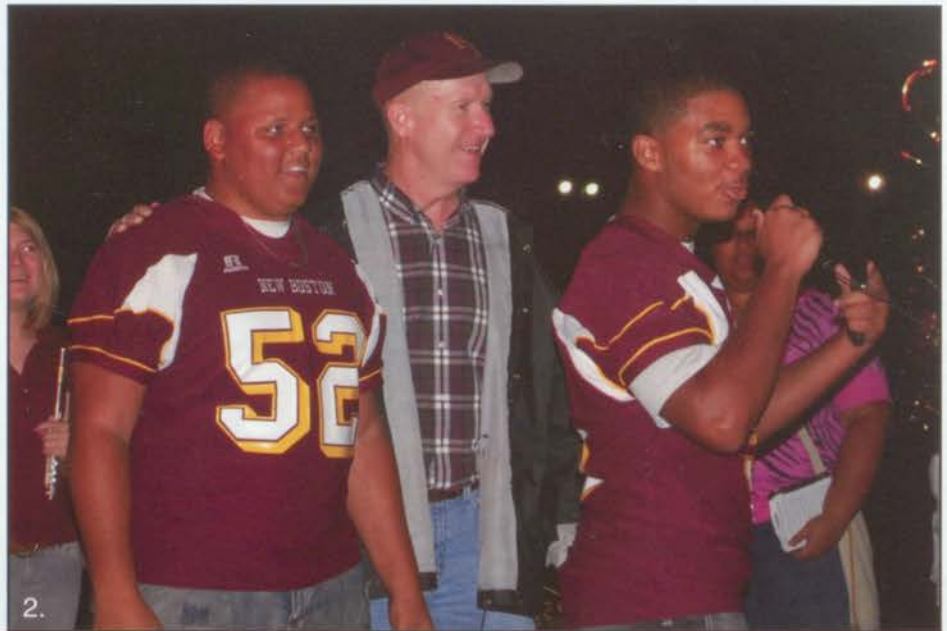

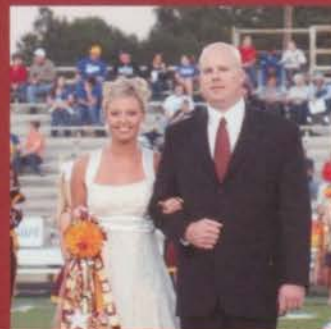

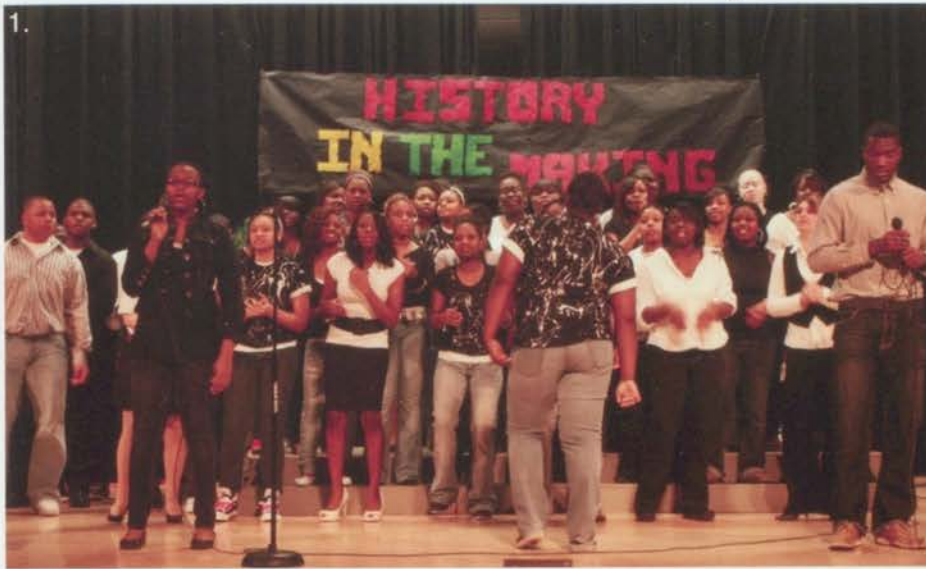

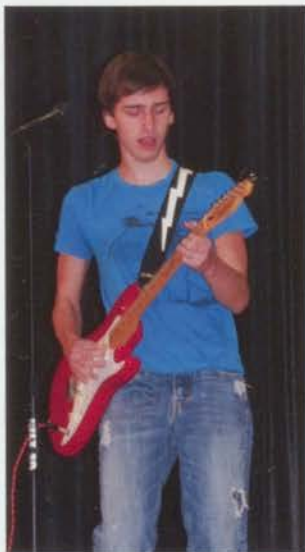

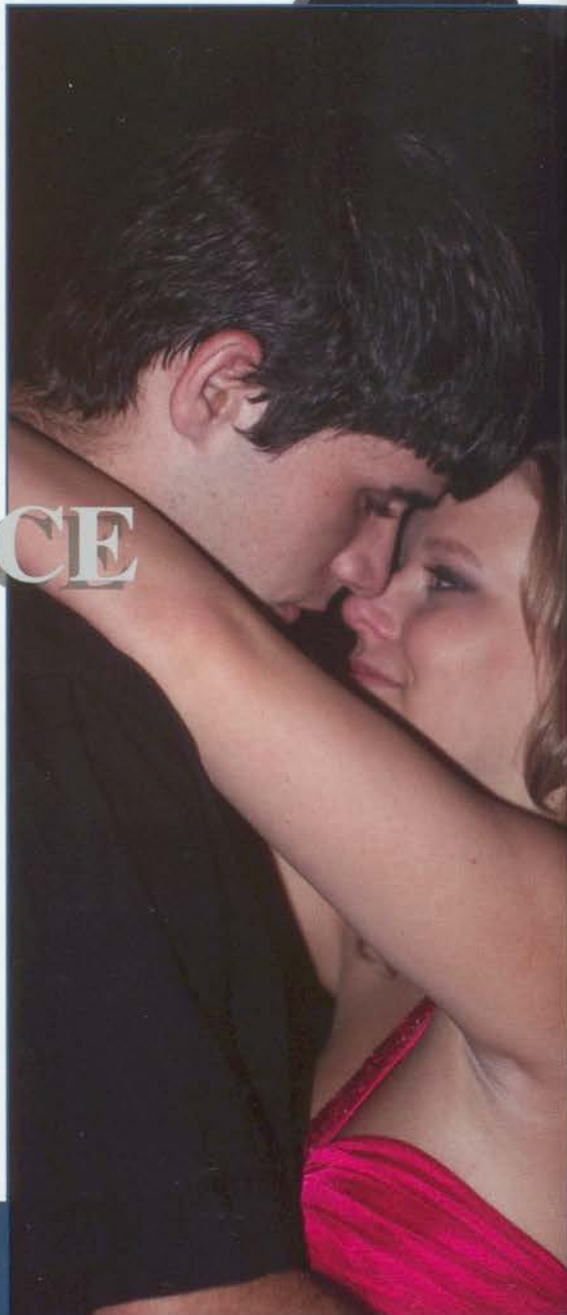

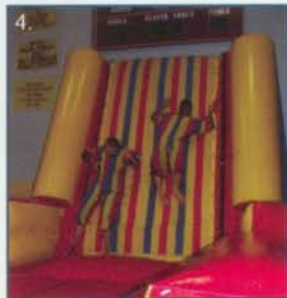

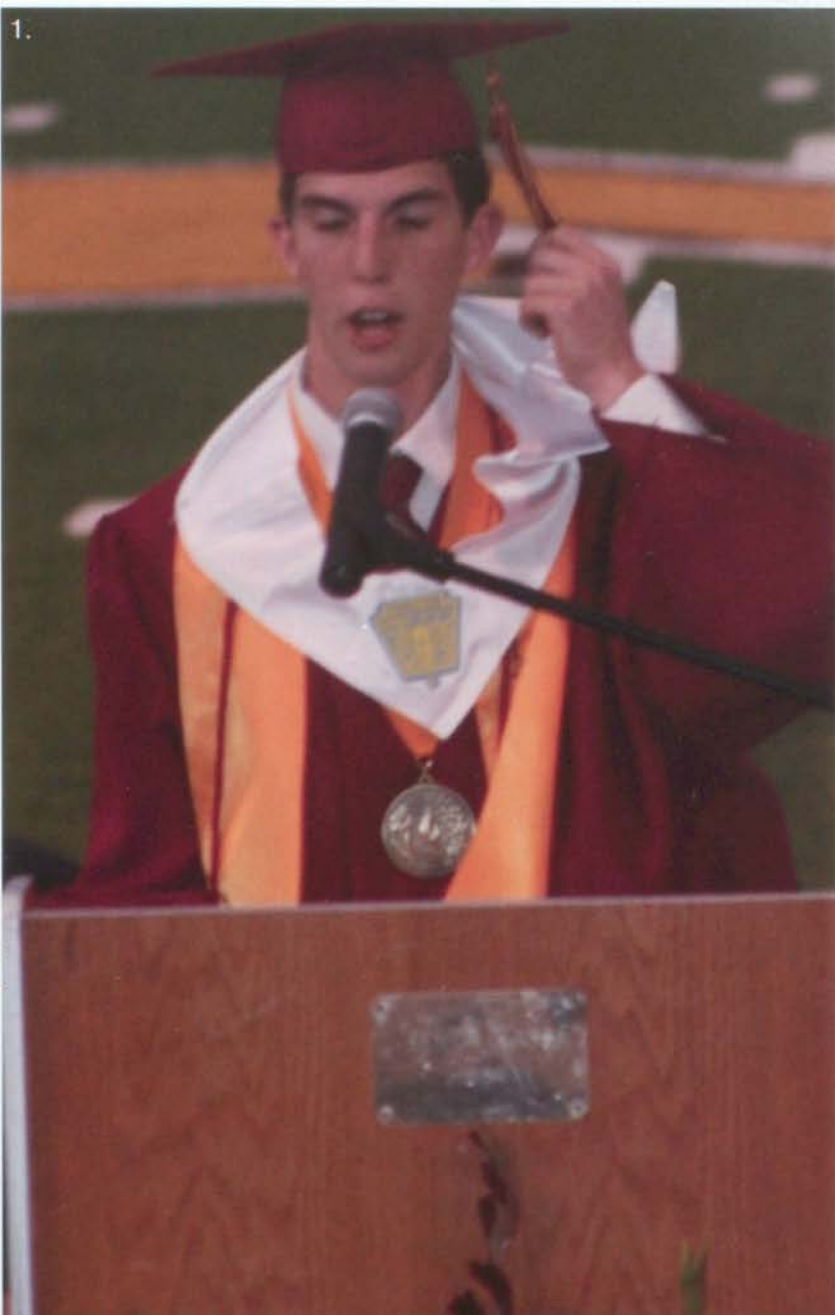

## faculty members take great strides for a cause

The walk seemed to become a full-time job. They were women on a mission. They were women helping to end breast cancer. For 5 months, faculty members Terrie Mayo and Sheryl King walked 4 to 5 times each week to prepare for the Breast Cancer 3-Day Walk in Dallas.

"I participated because I believe in the cause," King said. "My mother is a 20-year breast cancer survivor. Her story might not have had a happy ending without early detection. On the other hand, there are people whose stories don't have happy endings...I want to be part of ending that tragedy."

King said that the two prepared physically with a LOT of walking.

"We started training in April," King said. "It started out at 2-3 miles each training session and gradually increased. The weekends were our 'long walks'. By the end of our training we were walking between 15 and 18 miles each Saturday and Sunday."

In addition to preparing for the 3-Day walk, the group had to raise money to fund their endeavor.

"We sold cookbooks and Texas Road House peanuts, sponsored a dunking booth at Pioneer Days, our church held a dinner and bake sale for us, Texas Roadhouse had one night where a percentage of the proceeds were donated to us, and we received a lot of donations from very generous families, friends, and coworkers to raise funds," Mayo said.

The walk consisted of intense stretches of 20 miles per day. Participants slept in tents, showered in diesel truck trailers, and ate together in a large dining tent.

"It began with a wonderfully moving opening ceremony as the sun rose on the first day. From there we began our first 20-mile day. The first day was grueling. We had gotten up around 4:30 A.M. and didn't finish walking until around 4:00 P.M. that afternoon," King said. "The next days followed the same pattern. We walked and talked, then we walked and talked some more. At the end of the third day we arrived at Fair Park."

The third day brought the finish line in sight for the participants.

"I can't adequately describe the emotions as we entered the finishing area and finally the finish line," King. "Some finished the race nearly running, some finished with the aid of friends and teammates, and I was proud of myself."

This experience left every one of the participants with a sense of pride, and it affected them in a positive way.

"It was an awesome experience that I wish everyone, men and women, would commit to at least once in their life," Mayo said. "You come away with a deeper sense of gratitude for your own health and that of your family and a much greater admiration for the survivors and their families."

Both women agree that though it was a grueling physical challenge, the potential outcome of the Breast Cancer 3-Day Walk was well worth it.

"To see my mom with tears streaming down her face because she knew I had done the walk in her honor was the greatest feeling ever," King said. "The experience affected me profoundly. I completed an incredible physical challenge, but most of all I participated in something much bigger than myself. I know that I did something that can make a difference in someone else's life."

"After we arrived at camp, Terrie and I set up our little pink tent that would be our home for the next two nights," King said. "We arranged and rearranged our sleeping bags and gear trying to get settled in our approximately 6 foot by 6 foot area." 3. ## teachers return to their roots

Assistant Principal Angela Hastings felt the same way about school many other students feel today. "I didn't like coming to school. I thought it was boring," Hastings said. "I fell into the slacker group. I did as little as possible to get credit in my classes."

Hastings had two favorite teachers. "Ruth Webster was a great English teacher, because she cared about us," Hastings said. "Linda Brown was another favorite, because she saw our potential."

Homemaking teacher Linda Brown had the most effect on Hastings. "She awarded me a scholarship which made me feel like I needed to go to college long enough to use it," Hastings said. "I fell in love with learning."

Math teacher Adam Huggins never felt like he belonged to a group in high school. "I was definitely more of the nerd type, but I tried to fit into the country-boys group," Huggins said. "It didn't work really well, so you could say that I never really fit into one group except the outcasts - the ones who had something different about them that kept them from fitting into the other groups really well."

Huggins cannot pinpoint one particular teacher that impacted his life. "I was not the kind of student who had to be motivated to do anything," Huggins said. "I just did what I needed to in order to make decent grades, while other students definitely needed an attitude adjustment."

English teacher Sharon Purtle felt that she was not a bad girl, but was by no means a goody-goody.

"I did like to have fun and did some crazy things, but I knew if I was ever late for my curfew, my Daddy would be up waiting on me," Purtle said. "I was all about having fun, and I explained to my parents that making a 'B' was not a bad thing because it was much more important to have fun and make a 'B' than study all the time and make an 'A.'"

To Purtle, the biggest change has been the response to being involved in activities. "When I was in high school, we had many more active clubs," Purtle said. "For example, we had a very active FCS, a NIKE Club with initiation of members, we had FUN days at school which included all kinds of games and competitions, we had powder puff football, club meetings, and we had a 15-20 minute period every morning for visitation. I was very involved. I was in band and a majorette and in a lot of school clubs...always going to a meeting of some kind."

Principal Brian Bobbitt felt he fit in the "All-American" stereotype. "Some of my classmates gave me a hard time, because I wanted to be good in everything," Bobbitt said.

Bobbitt said Coach Ray had the biggest impact on him in high school. "He taught me that I could do anything I wanted if I was willing to work hard enough," Bobbitt said. "I never realized how much I was cheating myself by not putting out more effort."

The biggest changes have come from upgrading school facilities according to Bobbitt. "When I was in school, we still used Old Main," Bobbitt said. "We didn't have turf on the field, the baseball field was horrible, and the band hall was in the library,"

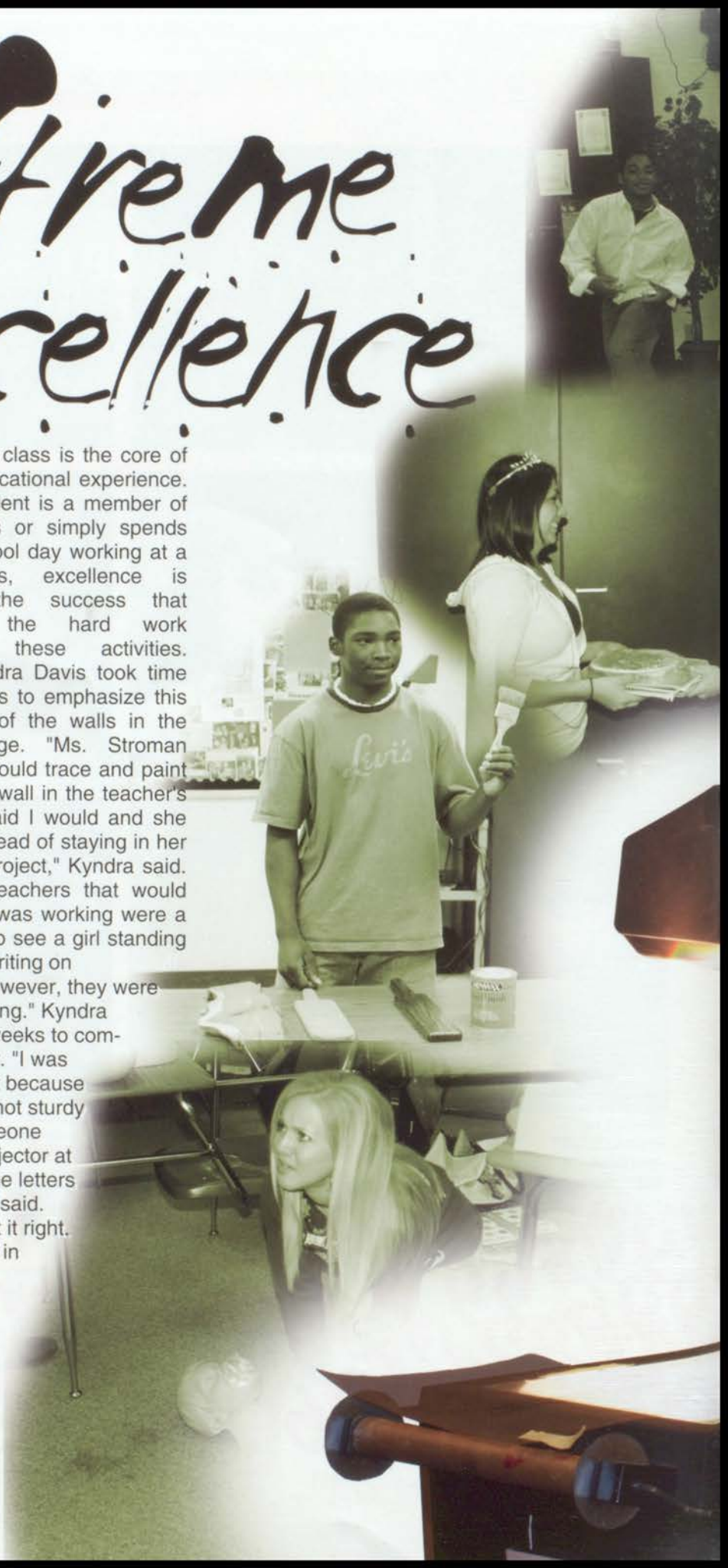

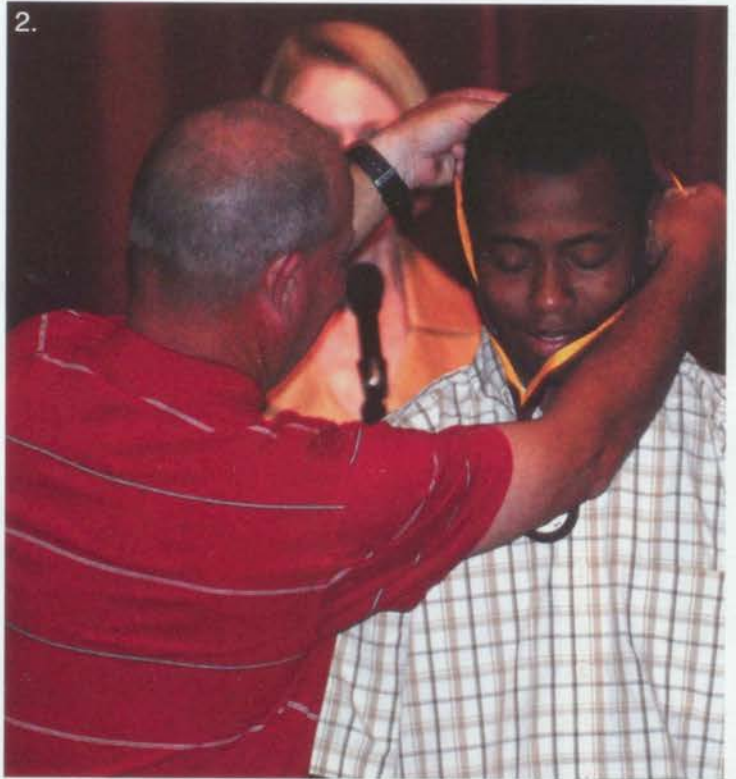

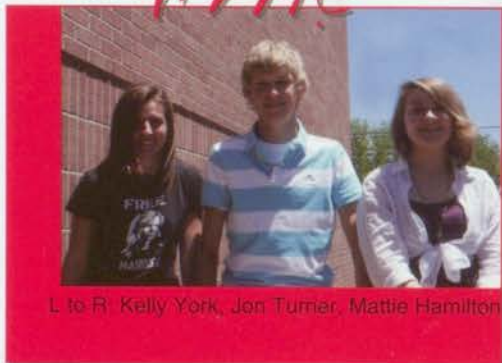
# Excellence Rewarded

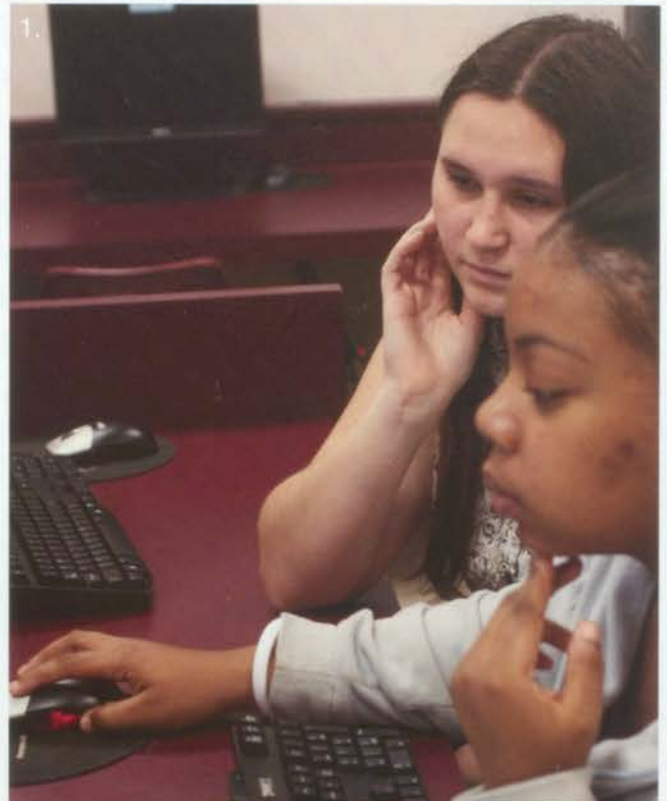

## How to judge a goat:

- 1 **Muscle** - this equals meat. You want a lot of muscle in the right shape (proportioned correctly throughout the body of the animal).
- 2 **Finish** - this is fat. You need the right amount of fat on a market animal. Too much fat gives a wastey carcass and greasy meat. Too little fat gives you tough, dry meat.
- 3 **Base width** - A goat should stand wide on his front feet and back feet. If you draw lines between his four hoof-prints, you should have a long, wide rectangle.
- 4 **Structural correctness** - all the bones should be put together correctly so that an animal can move freely, gain weight, and carry it to the time the animal is ready to go to market.
- 5 **Style** - For a show animal, you want all the things above put into a neat package that looks cool when the exhibitor presents the animal. When your goat walks into the show ring, his head should be up with a cocky attitude that says, "Look at me! I rock!"

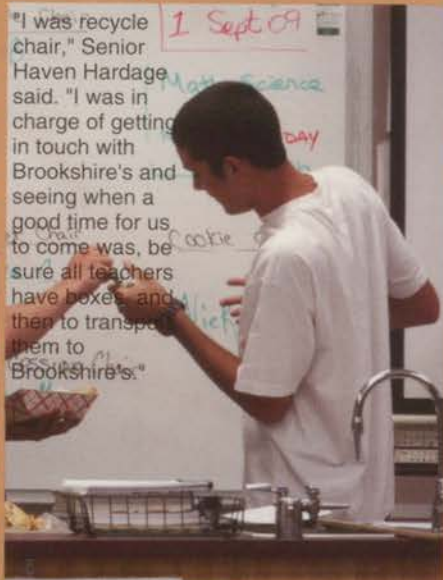

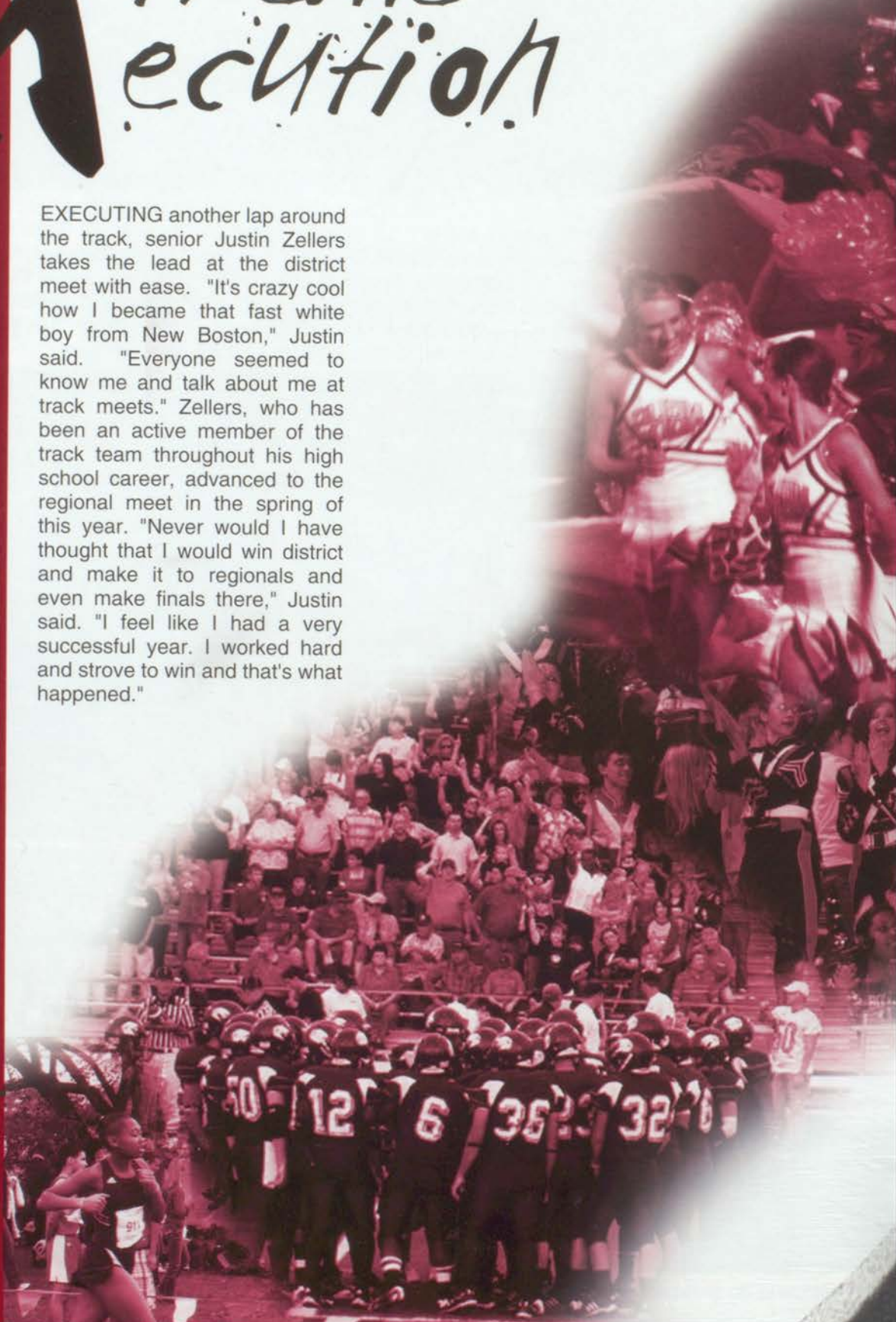

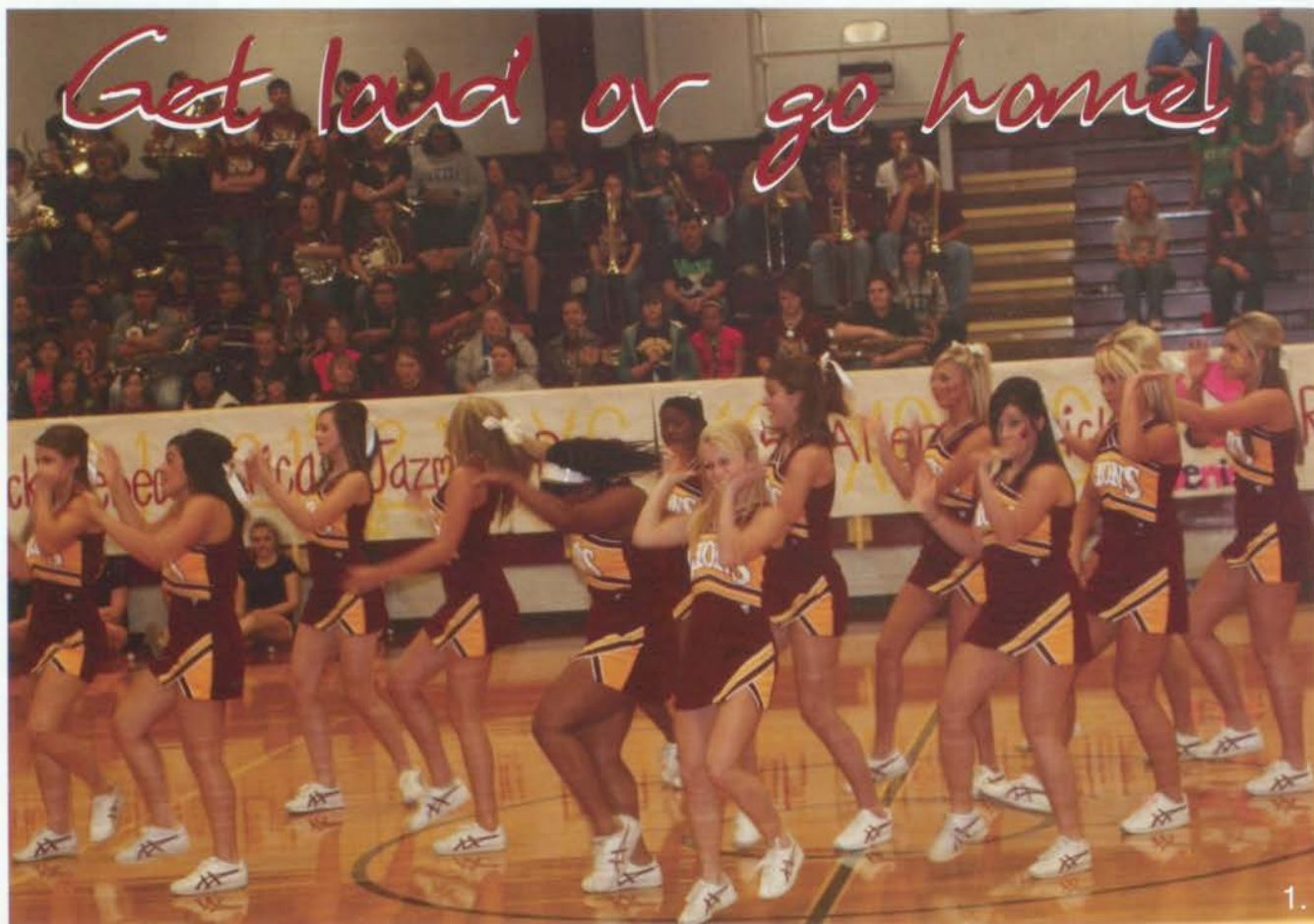

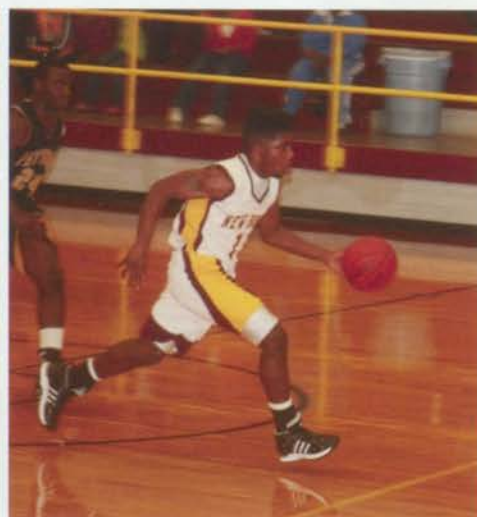

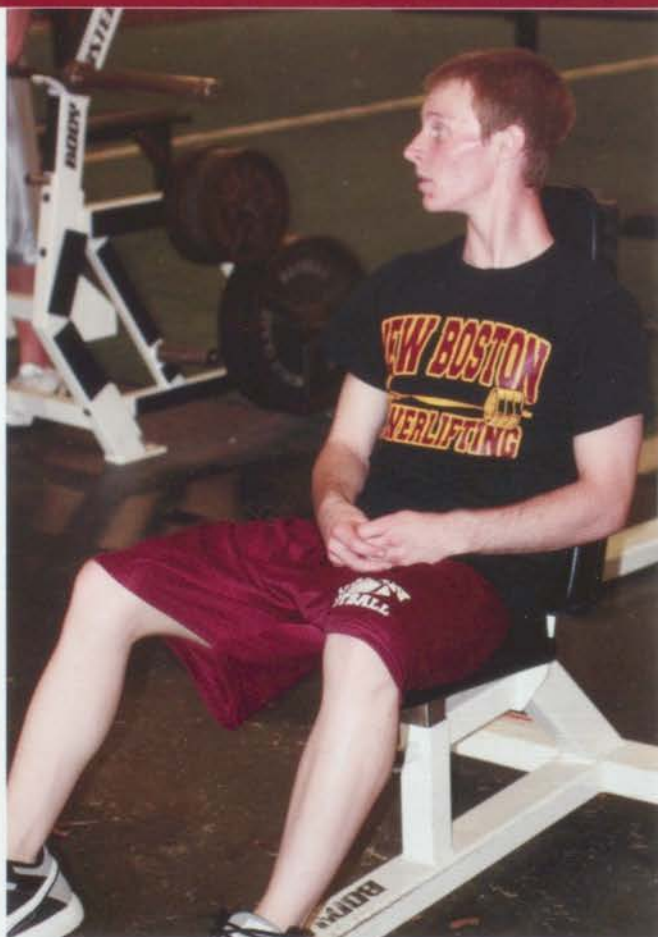
## McCoy Places at State

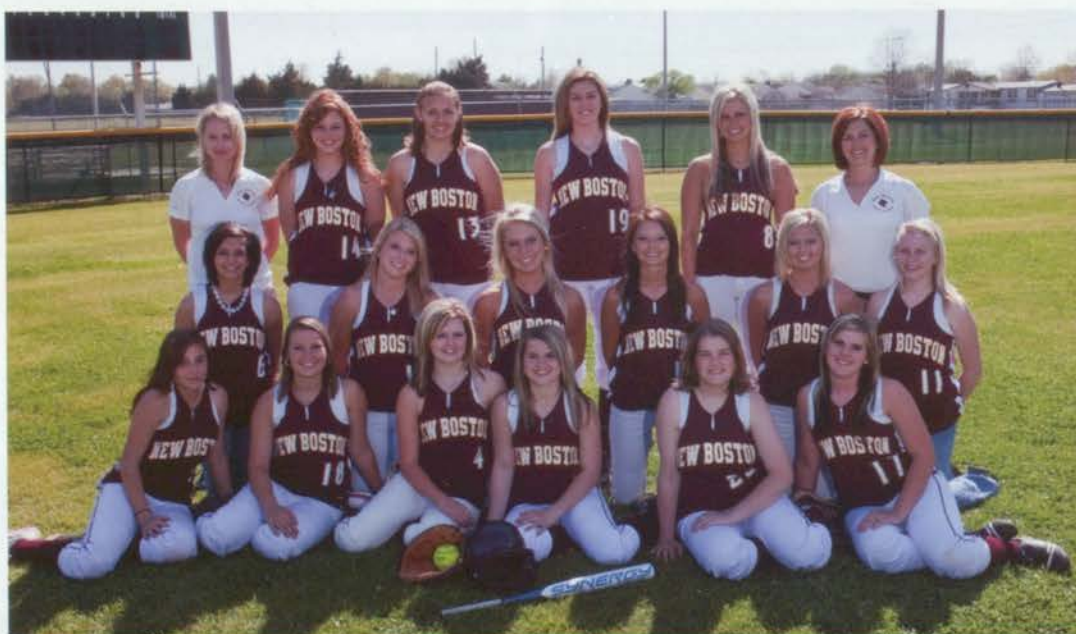

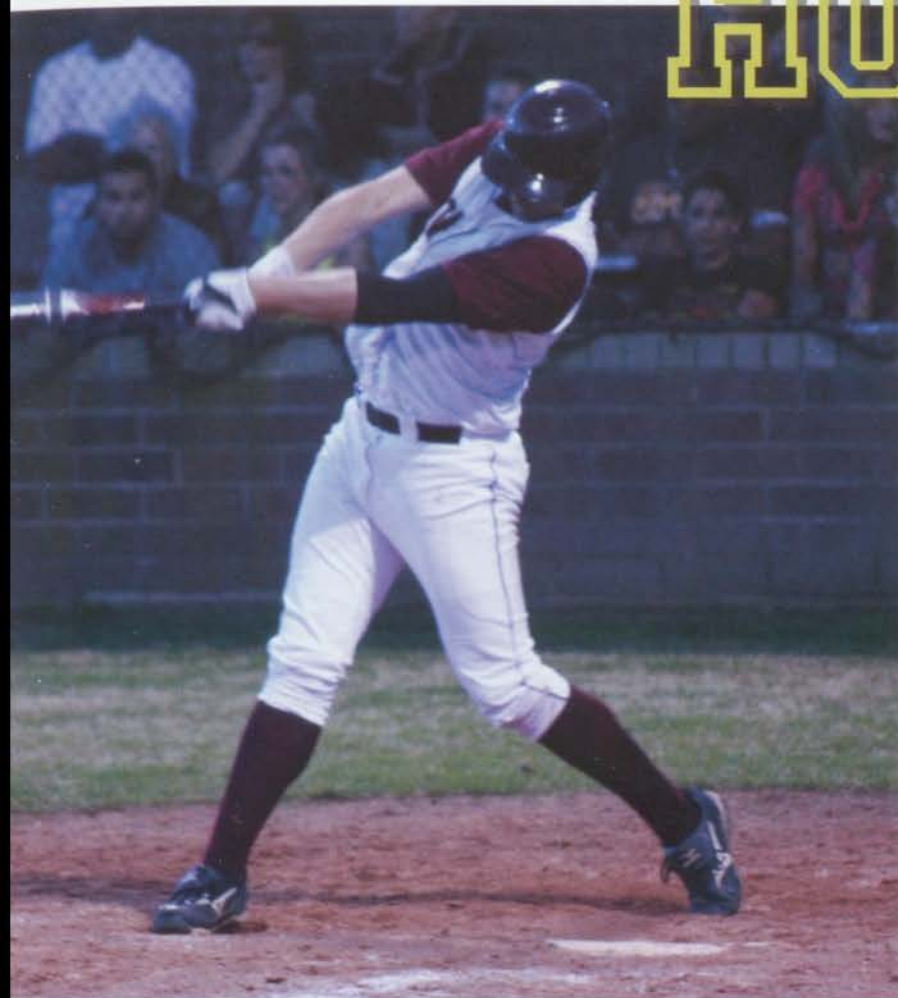

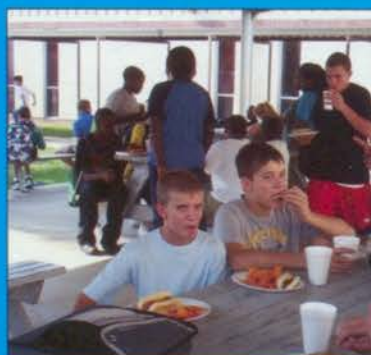

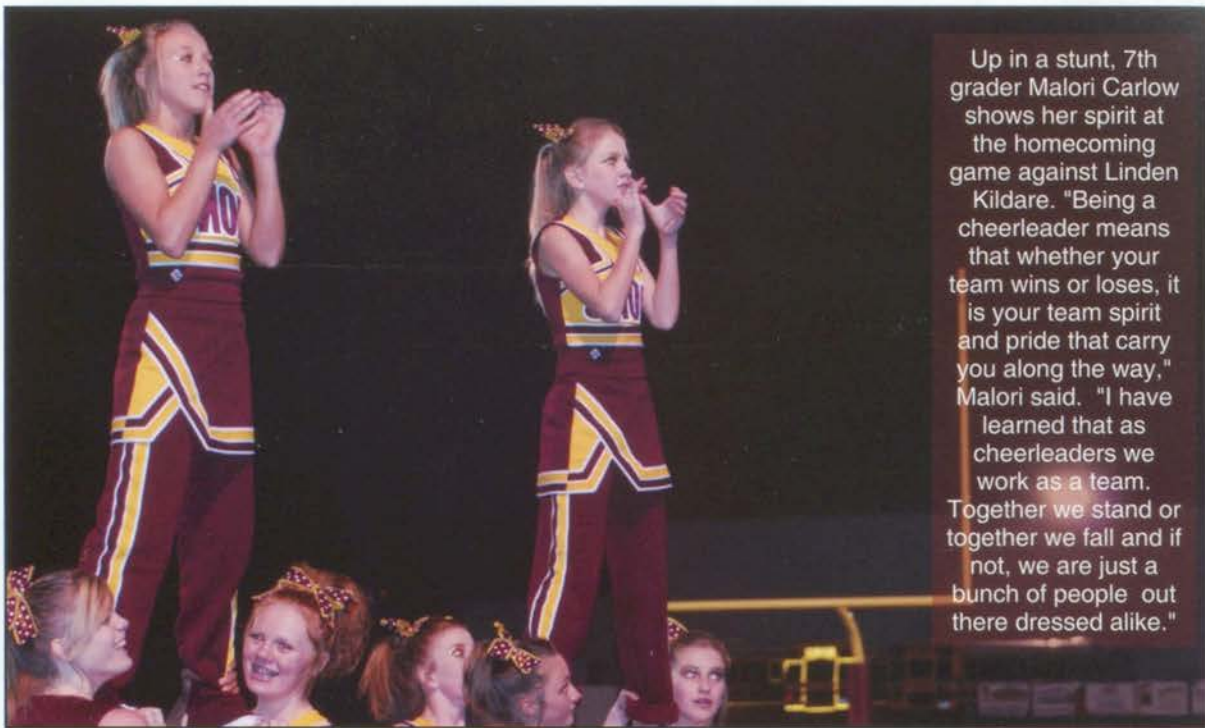

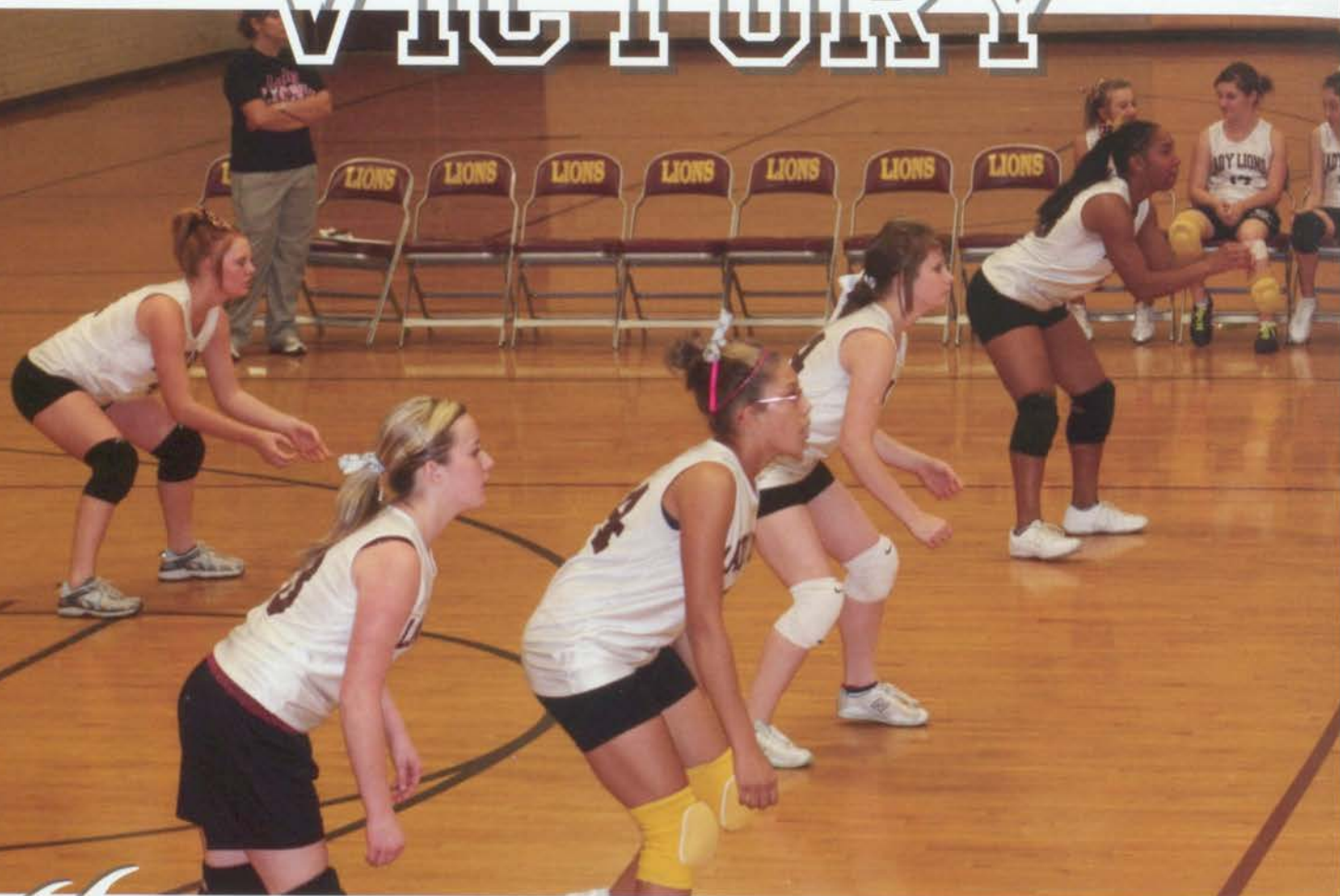

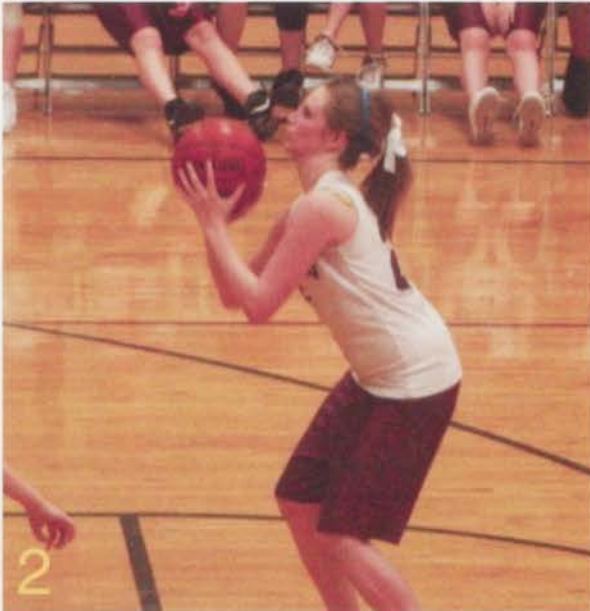

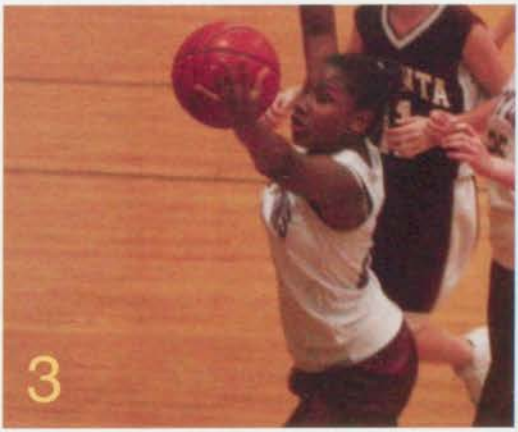
